

Minutes of the meeting of the third Central-Grant-in-Aid Committee for the Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Infrastructure Development Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (Elementary Secondary/Senior Secondary Schools) (IDMI) for the year 2013-14 held on 10.2.2014 at 2.30 p.m.under the Chairmanship of Secretary (School Education & Literacy)

The third meeting of the Central Grant-in-Aid Committee (GIAC) for the year 2013-14 for considering proposals under the Scheme for Infrastructure Development Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (Elementary Secondary/Senior Secondary Schools) (IDMI) was held on 10.2.2014 at 2.30p.m. under the Chairmanship of Secretary, School Education & Literacy. A list of participants is attached at **Annexure**. Ms.Meenakshi Jolly, Director, Department of School Education & Literacy welcomed the participants and presented the agenda for discussion and consideration of the Central GIAC.

Agenda-1:Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on 4.10.2013.

The Committee confirmed the minutes of the meeting held on 4.10.2013 as no objection was received from any quarter.

Agenda-2:Action Taken Report (ATR) on the minutes of the meeting held on 4.10.2014.

Action taken report was noted by the Committee.

Agenda-3:Budget provision under IDMI and proposal for consideration of Central GIAC

- The Committee noted the Budget provision for IDMI for the financial year 2013-14 is Rs. 2500.00 lakh after re-appropriation (States-Rs. 1999.00 lakh, UTs-Rs. 1.00 lakh and NER Rs. 500.00 lakh). Out of this, an amount of Rs. 2099.47 lakh has already been released during the current year. A balance amount of Rs. 400.53 lakh is available for disbursement during this year.
- The Committee was informed that there are no pending proposals from the last CGIAC meeting. It was also informed that priority would be given to all the past proposals which were approved earlier out of the balance amount of Rs. 4.00 crore. If any 2nd installment proposals are pending release, they would be released first, before any new proposals are taken up. The Committee was also informed that the 2nd Installment proposals received under the IDMI scheme from Maharashtra(Rs 4.50 cr.), Gujarat (Rs. 1.78 cr.) and Karnataka (Rs. 1.73 cr.) are under submission for release of funds.

- New proposals received from Maharashtra(50), Madhya Pradesh (4), Haryana (13), Tamil Nadu (6), Uttarakhand (4), Manipur (1), Mizoram (1) and West Bengal (172) were placed before the Central GIAC Committee for consideration and approval. The Committee examined all proposals under the scheme in the light of available infrastructure, class rooms in relation to enrollment of students and inter-district spread of proposals. The following decisions were taken:

(VI) MANIPUR

The central GIAC examined the one proposal received from the State. However, the same was rejected since it was informed that the school was running in a rented building.

(VIII) WEST BENGAL

The central GIAC examined all the proposals received from West Bengal. However, it was observed that all the institutions proposed for infrastructure were madaras which are not regular minority schools affiliated to the State or Central Boards of Education. The State representative informed that in West Bengal madaras are affiliated to State Madarsa Board. Therefore, the CGIAC did not take up the proposals and felt that the matter bears further examination.
