

Minutes of the first Meeting of Central GIAC for Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasa (SPQEM) and Infrastructure Development of Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (IDMI) held on 15th June, 2012

The first meeting of the Central Grant-in-Aid Committee (GIAC) for the Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasa Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasa (SPQEM) and Infrastructure Development of Private Aided/Unaided Minority Institutes (IDMI) for the year 2012-13 was held 15th June, 2012 in the Conference Room, C-Wing, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi under the Chairpersonship of Smt. Anshu Vaish, Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy. A list of participants is attached at **Annexure-I**. Shri Virender Singh, Deputy Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy welcomed the participants and presented the agenda for discussion and consideration of the Central GIAC.

Agenda 1: Confirmation of the minutes of the meeting held on 20th March, 2012.

Since no objection was received, the minutes of the Central GIAC meeting held on 20th March, 2012 were confirmed by the Committee.

Agenda 2: Action Taken Report (ATR) on the minutes of the meeting held on 20th March, 2012.

The Action Taken Report was noted.

Agenda 3: Budget provision under the Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasas (SPQEM) for 2012-13

The Committee noted the budget provision for SPQEM for the financial year 2012-13 as under:

Agenda 4: Approvals – Deferred proposals

- (i) The Committee was informed that the State Government of Bihar had earlier forwarded the proposal in respect of 1127 Madrasas for an amount of Rs. 4303.87 lakh for the year 2009-10. The proposal was placed before the Central GIAC in its meeting held on 25.7.2011. Considering the shortage of funds the GIAC had

approved only 50% of the amount viz. Rs. 3086.71 lakh required for the payment of salary to the teachers and full amount for other components. The release of grant against this approval was not made as the State was required to submit Utilization Certificate and Audited statement of expenditure/refund of unspent balance released during 2006-07 and 2007-08 under the old Scheme of AIIMP. As the State Government had now submitted the above said documents and Govt. of Bihar has refunded the amount of Rs. 9,78,796/- to Govt. of India, the release of Rs. 3086.71 lakh was agreed by the GIAC. The release of funds would be subject to the condition that the State Government have made a budget provision for this amount under the State budget for 2012-13.

- (ii) The Committee was further informed that an amount of Rs. 2266.97 lakh was approved by CGIAC in its meeting held on 21.09.10 for 724 Madrasas from Kerala but it was decided to release only 50% of Salary and full amount of other components. Accordingly, an amount of Rs. 1490.09 lakh was released to Govt. of Kerala on 14.02.2011. The Committee approved payment of the balance amount of Rs. 766.88 lakh to Govt. of Kerala towards teacher salary. The State Government representatives informed that he will submit the clarification regarding budget provision made in the State Government for utilization this amount.

Renewal Proposals

- (a) Assam - 486 Madrasas for the Year 2011-12**

State Government representative informed that the releases made earlier by the Central Government for the same proposals have not been disbursed to the teachers in the light of judgment delivered in a court case Hon'ble High Court Guwahati. The Committee therefore decided not to approve the renewal proposals submitted by the State Government at this stage. This committee decided that these proposals may be considered after the Court's decision in the case.

- (b) Bihar - (80 Madrasas) for the Year 2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12** The Committee examined the proposal received from the Bihar in respect of 80 Madrasas observed that these State GIAC approved proposals were received in the Ministry during the year 2011. As there is a time limit of one year prescribed under the existing guidelines of Scheme for Providing Quality Education in

Madrasas (SPQEM) to claim renewal, the committee therefore approved these proposal only for the year 2011-12 as detailed below:

GIAC observed that the above approval is subject to the State Government submitting Utilisation certificate in respect of 24, 790, 137, 482 & 675 Madrasas as detailed below :-

2. For 790 Madrasas partial UC for Rs.19,50,21,000/-- has been received out of Rs.20,14,58,000/- leaving a balance of Rs.64,37,000/-
3. For 137 Madrasas partial UC for Rs.3,21,01,000 has been received out of Rs.3,24,11,000/- leaving a balance of Rs.3,10,000/-
4. Against 482 & 675 Madrasas, UC is due for full amount.

Release of funds would be subject to submission of above mentioned Utilisation Certificates and availability of funds.

Agenda- 5: CGIAC thereafter considered fresh proposals under Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasa (SPQEM) received from various States. The Committee was of the view that with the available funds, it is very difficult to meet the committed liabilities in respect of Madrasas already covered under the scheme. The Committee approved the following proposal from Odisha for the year 2011-12 for 212 Graduate teachers, teacher training, Library books, Science/ Math kits and Science Lab in 98 Madrasas:

The above release will be subject to the State Government furnishing Utilisation Certificate for the earlier grant released by MHRD.

In respect of Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasa (SPQEM), the CGIAC took following decisions:

- 1) All the participants from States in future CGIAC meetings shall come prepared with the information that there is budget availability with the State Government for this scheme.
- 2) Some of the States are submitting proposals in respect of Intermediate Teachers. As per the scheme guidelines, such teachers will have to be qualified by next year. The relaxation for covering such teachers under Scheme for Providing Quality Education in Madrasa (SPQEM) is upto this year only (2012-13).
- 3) An amount of Rs. 2,01,750/- for reimbursement to NIOS towards registration of students of Madrasas, which has been released to the State of Uttar Pradesh, may be remitted to NIOS by the Uttar Pradesh Government.
- 4) A separate Head may be created for directly remitting funds to NIOS in future.

The Committee was informed that out of the allocated budget of Rs. 5000 lakh, an amount of Rs. 262 lakh has been released to Sikkim & Mizoram till date. **A balance of Rs. 4738 lakh is the balance available for disbursement.**

Agenda 7: Proposals for consideration of Central GIAC

The Central GIAC examined all pending proposals from Govt. of Kerala, Odisha, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Uttar Pradesh, Uttarakhand and Madhya Pradesh. Details of the approval are as under:

- (i) **KERALA:** The committee examined all the 51 proposals from Kerala and noted that the State Government has not furnished detailed individual break-up of the project in respect of each proposal. The State Government representative was asked to make available the detailed project report/estimates of every proposal which can be examined and if need be a special GIAC meeting can be convened

shortly. The State Government representative promised to do the needful within a week.

- (ii) **ODISHA:** As most of the proposals from Odisha pertain to Madrasas, the State Government representative was directed to verify whether these Madrasas are schools registered with the State School Board or any Central Board? GIAC therefore decided that the proposal in respect of Odisha can be consider only if the above mentioned details are furnished.
- (iii) **KARNATAKA:** The committee examined all 10 proposals from Karnataka and decided to accord priority to the minority concentration district under PM 15 Point Pogramme, blocks, town with substantial popularity of minorities as per Census 2001 listing. The committee noted that out of 10 proposals, no proposal is from Minority Concentrated District (MCD) in respect of Karnataka. The Committee decided to consider proposals from the minority concentration Blocks and towns where the minority population is 25 percent or more. Taking note of the above mentioned criteria, the State government representative indicated his priority for proposals to be considered by the Committee. Based on the recommendations/prioritization of the State representative, following proposals were approved by the Committee:
